

# Neshaminy Nipped

LANGHORNE — Quarterback John Rabuck threw four touchdown passes and scored two himself here last night as Liberty High of Bethlehem, Pa., manufactured its own "Hurricane," thumping Neshaminy, 40-33.

More than 2,000 fans looked on as the Redskins' second half bid for their first home victory of the year fell short. Coach Pete Cordelli's team, behind 33-13 at the half, outscored the Hurricanes, 20-7, over the final

24 minutes and had the ball on the Liberty 30 when time ran out.

It was all Rabuck and Joe Donaher, the favorite pass target in the first half as the senior quarterback threw four TD aerials to the 6-4 end. The passes covered 25, 68, 48 and 16 yards. Rabuck scored his two on runs of five and 11 yards.

Neshaminy cracked the ice in the free-scoring first period when Bill Daenz dove over right tackle from the two after Neshaminy marched 63 yards following Daenz' 30-yard return

of the opening kickoff. After Donaher scored his first TD, junior Doug Mason put the Redskins on the board again with a plunge from the one. Craig Vosburgh then kicked his first of three PATs.

Neshaminy was shut out in the second period but Craig Johns scored his first of two TDs to get the Redskins upset bid closer to reality. Johns' two-yard run culminated a short drive following a poor Liberty punt. Tom Prendergast got
