

# 'Skins Nip Allen, 7-6

ALLENTOWN — Neshaminy High School's football team capitalized the word DEFENSE last night.

The Redskins shut down William Allen High School's running attack and went on an air alert to contain the Canaries and register a rugged 7-6 victory.

Neshaminy utilized a brutal defensive effort in squaring its Big Six Conference slate at 1-1 before 5,100 fans. Coach Pete Cordelli's crew is 2-2 on the season. Allen dipped to an 0-2 mark in the league and is 1-2 in all games.

## Under Pressure

"We were under pressure all night," losing Coach George Halfacre said. "We couldn't run the ball and had to go to the air. And Neshaminy's kids were jamming our ends. We didn't get passing poise and our kids didn't charge their routes on patterns. It looked like the Neshaminy of old the way they played and nit."

Neshaminy did a lot of things correctly and constantly had the Canaries in an imaginary cage. The Redskins gave up just 29

yards rushing and a modest 59 lengths in the air — considering Allen quarterback Kim McQuilken launched 29 aerials.

Bob Reed, Neshaminy's punter, played a key role in keeping Allen in trouble. He boomed deadly kicks all over the field including a 71-yarder in the fourth period which pushed the Canaries back to their 13-yard line.

## Poor Field Position

"That punter kept us in bad field position the whole game," Halfacre sadly admitted.

Neshaminy's offensive punch didn't lack spark. Cordelli's Chargers drilled holes through Allen's line and piled up 209 yards, mainly with a power-wing set doing the damage.

"Our backs did a good job," Neshaminy backfield coach Jack Swartz said. "Bill Daenz (5-11, 175) and Craig Johns (5-8, 165) really played well, and they got some great blocking from Tommy Pendergast (5-8, 140) and Bill McGill (5-9, 170)."

## Outstanding Players

Cordelli was extremely happy with the defensive unit. He didn't want to single out players but there was no secret to the outstanding play of Bill Swenson (6-1, 170), Bruce Haynes (6-1,

240), Pete Markman (6-0, 200), Nick Fizzano (6-1, 200), Brian Ryder (6-0, 180) and Alex Feinman (6-0, 182), and Bruce Madden (5-7, 140).

"And I can't say enough about the defensive secondary," a jubilant Cordelli added, "They were put to the test and passed it."

Allen's touchdown came midway in the second period as the Canaries took advantage of a blocked punt. Reed, in his only failing, was rushed quickly by Allen's John Wildonger, a 6-3, 195-pound senior end. Wildonger blocked Reed's punt on the 46-yard stripe. Allen's Fred Wippel recovered the ball on the Neshaminy 24-yard line.

## Allen Scores

Tom Petro hit the line for a yard to the 23. McQuilken then began to circle Neshaminy's right end. He pitched the ball

back to Dayr! Tollinche, a 5-9, 179-pound sophomore, who wiggled his way down the sidelines into the end zone. Jim Barges' extra point kick was wide.

Neshaminy's touchdown came just after the second half opened. Allen put the ball in play on the 25-yard line. Tollinche fumbled a pitchout and lost six yards. McQuilken tried to pass but Swenson crashed him to the turf for an 11-yard loss to the seven yard line.

Tollinche took another pitch out but Swenson nailed him for a two-yard loss to the five. Don Quay went back to punt for the Canaries. Quay was rushed hard by Swenson and he hurried the kick. It was short and Neshaminy began operations on the 19-yard line.

## Play Recalled

In two carries, Daenz put the ball on the 11-yard stripe. Johns knifed through the line down to the five but they play was recalled because of a backfield in motion penalty.

With the ball on the 16, Daenz was stopped for a three-yard loss. On fourth down Mason, who executed his plays perfectly, went back to pass from the 19. Daenz, in the wingback position, and Bill Mahoney, a 6-1,

165-pound end collaborated on a picture-perfect play.

Mahoney, the left end, went deep and sucked Allen's defensive halfback into chest-tight coverage. Daenz floated into the vacated area and took an on-target throw from Mason. Daenz rumbled 12 yards into the end zone. Craig Vosburgh's boot split the uprights and Neshaminy had the point it needed to win the game.
