Connally's 81-yard return gives Neshaminy 6-0 victory

Brett Connally punctuated last night's Bishop Egan-Neshaminy Langhorne football game by driving an exclamation point into Egan's heart.

Connally ran back the second-half kickoff 81 yards for the only score in a 6-0 Neshaminy win before 4,000 at Neshaminy Stadium. The game opened the season for both teams.

"When he broke through the middle of the line, I said 'Oh, oh, there's trouble for us', "recalled Egan Coach Bill Travers, after losing this traditional Bucks County rivalry for the first time.

Egan had won the two previous games in the recently revived series that, in its glory days in the late 1960s, was virtually a state championship.
