# C.B. East, West at home against two tough teams

The place to be for some of the best football in the Philadelphia area this weekend will be Doylestown's War Memorial Stadium.

On Friday night (7:30 p.m.), Central Bucks West hosts Cardinal O'Hara, the team that ended the Bucks' 55-game unbeaten streak last year on the same field.

Then on Saturday (7:30 p.m.) Central Bucks East hosts defending Catholic League champion La Salle.

C.B. West is on a modest 5-game winning streak, 48 games shy of its most recent win streak. The Bucks are 2-0 this season, with a 35-6 win over Souderton and a 14-13 win over Plymouth-Whitemarsh last Friday night. O'Hara comes into tomorrow's game at 0-1 following a wild 39-37, last-play loss to West Chester East last Saturday.

Does that one-point C.B. West-Plymouth-Whitemarsh score seem familiar?

A year ago, the Bucks had a 10-9 win over Plymouth-Whitemarsh before the game with O'Hara. Scheduled to be played at Springfield High's field in Delaware County, inclement weather forced postponement of the game and a rescheduling on a Monday night in Doylestown. The Lions scored the streak-busting 13-10 victory on a fourth-period field goal.

Offensively, Certral Bucks West has to date been led by a pair of juniors, quarterback Greg Moylan and scatback Matt Soncini. Soncini has scored 3 TDs, two on punt re-

turns against Souderton and one on a pass from Moylan against P-W. Moylan has one other TD pass and has run for another score.

Central Bucks East has been impressive in two opening victories, over Coughlin (Wilkes-Barre), 7.0, and 28.6 over Archbishop Wood last Saturday night. La Salle (1-0) is one of only two Catholic League schools to have won its opener, 21-0, over Upper Dublin.

C.B. East senior quarterback Mike Morelli has passed for two touchdowns, and the Patrioits' 5 TDs have been scored by five different players. Coach Lary Greene has plenty to choose from offensively, with two players, Ray Crawley (against Coughlin) and Brian Titus (vs. Wood), already having 100-plus yards rushing games.

Bishop Egan (0-1) at Bensalem (2-0), tomorrow, 7:30 p.m.

Bensalem has outscored two Philadelphia Catholic League Northern Division teams, Archbishop Wood and Archbishop Ryan, by a combined 44-3, and limited them to a grand total of 83 yards in combined total offense. The Owls' Edmund Robinson has rushed for 245 yards. Egan was shut out, 37-0, by Neshaminy in its opener last Friday.

Father Judge (0-1) at Neshaminy (1-0), tomorrow, 7:30 p.m.

Quarterback Cornelius White's 225 passing yards and three touchdowns

in the Redskins' 37-0 rout of Bishop Egan could mean Neshaminy may put a lot of points on the board this season.

Father Judge, a perennial Catholic League contender, dropped a 13-0 game at Pennsbury Saturday, but has a top pass-catch combination in quarterback Jerry Smink and receiver Charlie Warner.

Harriton (0-1) at Morrisville (1-0), tomorrow, 7:30 p.m.

Troy Wilson is trying to step into graduated Eric Sessons' role as the Buildogs' offensive leader. He had 76 yards rushing and scored 2 touchdowns in Saturday's season-opening 140 win at Salisbury Township (Allentown). Harriton, of the Del-Val League, was led by its quarterback, Kyle Helton (2 rushing touchdowns, threw for a third) in their opening 28-21 loss to Lower Moreland, an Independence League rival of Morrisville.

### Truman (0-1) at Spring-Ford (0-1), tomorrow, 7:30 p.m.

Truman lost its 12th straight game over two seasons when Cheltenham handed the Tigers a 22-13 defeat Saturday. Tim Tucker threw a TD pass in the loss.

Archbishop Wood (0-2) at Roman Catholic (0-1), Saturday, 11 a.m.

Wood has been soundly beaten by two powerful Suburban One National teams, Bensalem (27-0) and Central Bucks East (28-6). The Vikings' lone score has been a 48-yard pass from Brian Lafond to Brian Kennedy. Roman features senior all-purpose back Marvin Harrison, who rushed for 151 yards, including a 74-yard scoring
