

Dieruff Survives, 14-13

Neshaminy Rally Dies

ALLENTOWN, Pa. — Neshaminy High rallied for two final period touchdowns here last night in Allentown Stadium, but it wasn't enough as host Dieruff (4-1) relied on its two first half TDs for a 14-13 win.

Ted Steiner's recovery of Doug Mason's fumble on the Neshaminy 26-yard-line set up the first Dieruff TD, which saw

quarterback Ross Moore pass 26 yards to tailback Jack Wenner on the first play from scrimmage. Dieruff struck for another six pointer after driving 44 yards in three plays in the second period. Moore swept right end for the TD with 1:24 showing.

On the third play in the final quarter, Dieruff was forced to punt from deep in its territory. Neshaminy's Steve Sroba ran

the ball back from the Dieruff 43 to the 39. Then, after a Mason-to-Bill Daenz 20-yard pass, Craig Johns went off left tackle into the end zone with 10:04 left in the game.

Neshaminy (2-3) ended the scoring with 3:30 left when Johns evaded over the goal line from the one. The Redskins started the drive on the Dieruff 40. Nine plays later, Johns went in standing up.

while two extra-point kicks by Gene Stahler made the difference in Allentown Dieruff's 14-13. Big Six victor yover Neshaminy, which got two touchdowns from Craig Johns.

Neither Princeton Day School nor Neshaminy were as fortunate as the three other area schools that went to the gridiron on Friday. Neshaminy lost a 14-13 heartbreaker to Dieruff of Allentown and the PDS team gave up a 6-0 lead in bowing, 28-12 at the hands of Chestnut Hill Academy.

Gene Stahler's conversions and the passing and running of Ross Moore enabled Dieruff to edge Neshaminy, 14-13. Moore hit Jack Wenner with a 26-yard scoring aerial in the first period and the former ran six yards in the second with Stahler kicking the extra point after each.

Neshaminy rallied behind Craig Johns' two TDs (runs of one and eight yards), but Craig Vosburgh was able to convert only once.
