

Indians shock Neshaminy

"That's the best team we've played all year, based on their performance today," said a stunned Pat Allison, after watching his Neshaminy High School football team get manhandled, 21-0, by Council Rock on Saturday in Newtown.

"I suppose somewhere along the line, I didn't impress on them the importance of this game," Allison concluded, as he groped for an answer to explain his team's poor performance.

It appeared as if Council Rock, not Neshaminy, was the

team that was fighting for a shot at a league title.

"We left our kids had to prove something after a poor showing last week, and they did," said winning coach Walt Snyder.

Two penalties that nullified Council Rock scoring plays kept the game from being a rout.

A holding call nullified Jeff Sargent's 28-yard field goal, while a clip stopped Glen Rappaport's 26-yard interception return from being a score.

Dan Huff's arm accounted for two of the three Indian scoring plays that did count.

Huff hit Jim Rappo with a 20-yard strike to give Council Rock a 6-0 lead with just 50 seconds gone in the second quarter. Jeff Sargent booted through his first of three extra points and the Indians led 7-0.

The Huff to Rappo combination struck again, this time for 53 yards, with just 1:28 left in the game to give Council Rock an untouchable 21-0 lead.

"I haven't had a good season, but today everything was perfect," Huff said.

In between these two scores, sophomore running back Guy Allen got a chance to show his speed. He took Huff's handoff and outran the only defender that his offensive line hadn't taken care of as he went 38 un-

touchable yards around left end to make it 14-0.

Allen's score was set up by Allison's surprising decision to go for a first down on fourth and three at his own 38, with over nine minutes left in the game.

The Council Rock defensive line made the big play as they had done all game when they stopped Tom Dodd one yard short of a first down.

"There was no use waiting for next week," Allison said in explaining his decision, "we had to win today."

"I was very surprised by his decision to go for it," Snyder said.

Allen's score came two plays after the Redskins had been stopped on their fourth down gamble.

"We want the feeling that we have right now to carry over into next season," Snyder said as he watched his sophomore and junior dominated team celebrate their biggest win of the year.
