LANGHOLME — Dieruff got only 16 yards of total offense Friday night, but 41

of them came on one third-period drive and carried the Huskies to a 6-0 Big Eight victory over Neshaminy.

Coach Bruce Trotter's club, in defeating the Redskins for the first time since 1959 and dropping them to 9-2 in the Big Eight and 9-4 overall, played fine defense, too, while evening its overall record at 3-2.

Neshaminy's deepest penetration of the game was to the Dieruff 24 in the third quarter, and that time the Huskies stopped a fourth-down play short of a

first down.

Neshaminy took a gamble in its own territory; and Dieruff stopped it to pave the way for the game's only score.

The touchdown drive took nine plays, with Pete Farmer contributing an 11-yard gainer and Dave Spangler a 10-yarder. Spangler capped the drive when he scored from three yards out. It was the first touchdown of the season for Spangler, who had gained over 700 yards a year ago.

Spangler finished the game with 52

yards on 20 carries, while Farmer had 42 on 13 tries. Neshaminy, which got only 144 total yards, didn't have any one back gain more than 40 yards. John Rynkiewicz was the leader with 37 yards on 15 attempts. The Redskins completed just six of 19 passes for 54 yards.
