Big 8 team

Bill Heilman, a 215-pound senior fullback-linebacker from Easton, was the only player to make the first team both ways yesterday when the Big Eight Football Conference coaches selected their annual all-star team at a meeting at Holiday Inn East. Pennsbury, which for the third straight season went through its Big Eight campaign without a defeat, led in first-team selections, with five of its players being named to the offensive unit and three more being selected on defense.

Heilman was the only Easton player picked to the offense team, and the Red Rovers had four selected to the defense. In addition, two Easton specialists and one specialist from Pennsbury were named by the coaches.

Six of the eight teams had representatives on the first offensive or defensive unit. Liberty placed three on offense, two on defense; Dieruff had two picked to the offensive team; Neshaminy placed two on the defensive unit, and Allen had one player on offense.

Only five juniors made the first team. They included Drew Wennak, Allen's talented split end; Jim Patelis, a 180-pound guard from Liberty, kicker Vince Giordano of Pennsbury; defensive end Steve Shall of Neshaminy, and Rich Garza, a 280-pound defensive tackle from Liberty. Helitman beloud the Bed Rovers to a

second-place finish in the conference their only loss was to Pennsbury — and to an overall record of \$-2.

The coaches selected first and second teams as well as hostorable mention performers. The oily player to be named to the first team on one unit and the second on another was Dieruff's Randy Bernhard, a 10Popunder who was picked at first-team guard on offense and at linebacker on the second defense.
