Prior (6-3), Austin (5-7): Big Reason Pennsbury's 11-0

Put 6-foot-3 Frank Prior next to 5-foot-7 Bill Austin and it's tempting to haul out the old "Mutt and Jeff" line.

But together, Prior and Austin were two big reasons why Pennsbury finished as one of Pennsylvania's top-ranked football teams this season.

Both Prior and Austin were overwhelming first-team selections on The Inquirer's 1974 All-Area high school football team, announced Sat-

Pennsbury, undefeated in 11 games, and Archbishop Wood, which won its first city championship earlier this month, were the only schools

to fill two positions on the 24-player squad, selected by a panel of 119 coaches and Inquirer sportswriters. Named to the team from Archbishop Wood were kicker-halfback

In addition to the All-Area team, a 24-player second-team was also se-

A 24-player second-team was also selected while 144 players received honorable mention. More than 10,000 athletes who played football in the Delaware Valley were considered for the teams.

Austin led the Lower Bucks County League with 17 touchdowns this season and had 11 TDs last year as the conference leader. Despite Austin's size, Coach Chuck Kane said he considers him "big-college material" along with Prior, who bench presses 300 pounds.

First-team guards and tackles are players from schools that combined for a 38-3 record—Herb Beck of Malvern Prep (10-0), Ed Hanker of Sterling (9-0), Bob Brewer of West Chester Henderson (8-3) and Tony Spinosa of Central Bucks West (11-0).

Both ends—Lee Felice of Frankford and Mike Saksa of Archbishop Carroll—are considered among the area's blue-chip prospects by college

"In 10 years, I'd have to say that Lee Felice would be among the very best players I've coached," said Coach Al Angelo of Frankford.

Saksa caught 60 passes for 1,107 yards this season although he was often overshadowed by teammate Mike Bailey, the Archbishop Carroll

Heading the backfield is Bailey, who came within a single completed pass of leading the Patriots to the Catholic League championship this

Joining Austin and Bailey in the backfield are Alby Banks, who led Radnor to a 7-2-1 season (its only losses were to Trinity and Archbishop Carroll) and Glassboro's Vaughn Young, who scored 26 touchdowns this year.

Defensively, the All-Area squad is strictly big-time. Joining Bucci in the line are ends Mike Mill of Central Bucks West, Camden's Calvin

One of them could be The Inquirer's Coach of the Year.

At linebacker, Mark Sydw helped Central to the Public League championship while Jim Ryan of Bishop Eustace is regarded 'one of

the most intelligent players I've coached" by Bob McQuillan, the Crusaders' defensive coordinator. West Catholic's Brett Egan "can name the school he wants to attend."

The team's three defensive backs are also quarterbacks. Cheltenham's Steve Goldberg, John Yannetti of
