Pennsbury Breezes, 49-13

Pennsbury has a hungry defense. That's because coach Chuck Kane and his assistants buy them milkshakes and steak sandwiches if they put points on the board.

Saturday afternoon, Mike Ramsey put his own personal dent in the coaches' wallets. In the third period, he blocked Neshaminy's punt by Terry Gallagher and raced 45 yards for a score.

The first blocked punt for the Falcon defense this year turned the game into a rout. Pennsbury went on to trounce visiting Neshaminy, 49-13.

A standing room only crowd watched the Falcons finish their 11-game season unbeaten and captured the Lower Bucks Section One crown. Last week, Pennsbury wrapped up the Big Eight title.

Terry Fitzpatrick's two-yard run put the home team ahead on the first play from scrimmage after Neshaminy fumbled the opening kickoff.

Fitzpatrick's second short touchdown dash and the second of Vince Giordano's seven extra points made it 14-0 before Harry Ulrich cut the margin by seven with a 68-yard aerial to Eli Weissman.

The Falcons dominated the rest of the way, however. Quarterback Joe Crossin hit

Scott Fryse with a 21-yarder for the lone score of the second quarter.

After Ramsey's blocked punt, league-leading scorer Bill Austin added six points to his total on a 36-yard run. Crossin's one-yard plunge gave Pennsbury a 35-point lead.

Radnor Shuts Out Lower Merion, 28-0

In a series that began in 1897, Radnor cut its deficit to 39-30-9 by pinning a 28-0 loss on Lower Merion.

The Red Raiders, getting their third consecutive shut-out, jumped out to a 21-0 lead in this traditional contest between the Main Line schools.

Dean Johnson sparked the winners by hurling three long scoring passes, including TD tosses of 16 and 42 yards to Willie Syndor. His longest, however, was a 67-yarder to John Caserta.

While Johnson was connecting on nine-of-19 for 259 yards, the Red Raider defense only allowed three LM completions in 28 attempts. Syndor caught four of Johnson's throws for 11 yards.
