

Donchez, Petchel, Parry Top Leagues in Scoring

Liberty's Tom Donchez, Pen Argyll's Woody Petchel and Slatington's Glenn Parry won scoring championships in their respective football leagues.

Donchez, a 196-pound fullback who last week was named to the United Press International All-State team, scored nine touchdowns and ran for four two-point conversions — 62 points — in the Big Seven Conference.

Petchel, who scored 186 points overall — third best in the entire state — tallied 20 touchdowns and one conversion in the Lehigh-Northampton League for 122 points — 72 more than Ken Steward of league champion Nazareth.

Parry scored 10 touchdowns, kicked six extra points and ran for eight conversions to score 82 points in winning the Lehigh

Valley League title for Slatington — the only undefeated team in The Morning Call area. His teammate, end Karl Andreas, was second with seven touchdowns and three conversion passes for 48 points.

Donchez, who led Liberty to its best season in 15 years, won the conference scoring title by 20 points over Steve Sroba of Neshaminy, who tallied 42 in helping his team to a share of the title with Dieruff and Pennsbury. Sroba picked up his points on seven touchdowns. Bill Ali of Dieruff was third with 36 points, again all on touchdowns.

Pat Caffrey and Bob Handschue of Allen were in a multiple tie for sixth place with 18 points.

Salisbury, which battled Nazareth to the wire before yielding

the LNL title, had George Spadt and Jim Cressman taking third and fourth places with 42 and 40 points.

Although Parry won the LNL title with ease, there was a close battle for the next five positions. Trailing Andreas's 48 were Bruce Barry of Lehigh with 46, Ben Branch of Emmaus with 44, Bob Kemmerer of Slatington with 42 and Bill Paukovits of Northampton with 41.
