TRACK



VINCENT HERMANSON HEAD TRACK COACH

Ever since the days of the old Hulmeville High School, Track has been a prominent feature in the athletic program of the successive high schools, that are part of the history of the present Neshaminy School District.

In the early years with competition of the County at Bristol High, and the subsequent years at Sel-Park High School in Perkasie, the future Neshaminy High always was outstanding in the County Meets which were the most prominent athletic contests of the school year.

During the depression years track prowess at Langhorne-Middletown High School (later Neshaminy) still shown forth. In the Philadelphia area the track team enjoyed the name of the speed-way boys.

World War II saw the sport die and remain quiet until 1949 when it had a revival under Tom Snipes, a former teacher of Social Studies. In 1951 Mr. Hermanson took over the track coach responsibilities and we moved into a newly organized league — The Lower Bucks County Athletic League. The

school, since those early days, has enjoyed the prominence of the finishing first or second in league standing, has organized the "Meat of Champions," has been successful in the Penn Relays, has entertained the local populace with such great track names as: Don Bragg, world pole-vault champ, Frank Budd, the world "Fastest Human," Paul Drayton, Villanova sprint great, The Villanova Relay Teams of World Renown, to only mention a few.

As the years have progressed so has Neshaminys' Track Teams. The last two years have seen teams of championship calibre unequalled in the Lower Bucks Athletic League. The future holds great promise, because through Neshaminys' method of Coach interest of education at all levels, we become aware of boys interested in a total program. Of boys aware that coaches and teachers are encouraging them to be competitive. It is truly this close student-teacher-coach relationship that produces the greatness of Neshaminy.
