### BILL SCHWARTZ – A LINEMAN'S DREAM COME TRUE

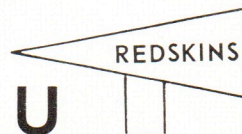
Schwartz, a senior at 5'9" and 190 lbs. plays tackle on offense and line backer on defense. Bill comes from Levittown, Pennsylvania.

## *Tonight's Win for the East Penn Championship*

### Reviewing the game . . . . .

Another typical 1963 thriller, this time to the last second, as the Redskins defeated the Dieruff Huskies 13-7. Highlighting the night's action was the Dieruff fumble which Bill Schwartz recovered and ran 29 yards to give Neshaminy an early 7-0 lead. The score stunned the Huskies attack during the entire first half. Dieruff had heard of and feared the great Bob Baxter who added the final blow with his spectacular 70 yard run from scrimmage with 45 seconds remaining in the first half of the game.

During the second half the 'Skins played a defensive game as they stood off the Husky attack. Tension began to mount after the Dieruff score in the third quarter. A minute and a half remaining, Huskies in possession, 1st and 10 on the Neshaminy 27 – this was the situation which kept the Neshaminy fans glued to their seats down to the last play. The Dieruff Quarterback in a last grandstand effort retreated to pitch the hopeful T.D. pass which was intercepted by Jack Dunn to end the game. Victory again came to the Neshaminy Redskins.

### Tonight . . . . .

The Redskins of Neshaminy meet the Liberty High School Hurricanes of Bethlehem, Pa. Liberty High, built in 1922, was designed to serve as a war memorial "commemorating the valor of Bethlehem men who went to the front." Hence the name "Liberty High School" was adopted. The school boasts a huge stadium capable of seating 16,588 persons. Besides a modern gymnasium seating 4000 offering excellent facilities for basketball and wrestling, additional land area offers the 3200 students facilities for tennis, soccer, baseball, softball, track, archery and hockey – an all round athletic program.

Coach Pat Garramone's "11" have rolled up a 3-1 record thus far this season. Last week the Hurricanes defeated William Allen 6-0, this however, was not a league game. They will play Allen later in the E.P.L. League Game. Their only loss was by the hands of the strong Baltimore Polytech School. Bethlehem will be looking for revenge for the 34-14 trouncing the Redskins gave them.

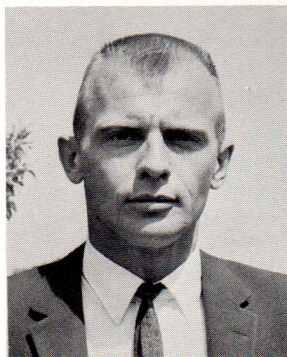
### ATHLETIC DIRECT

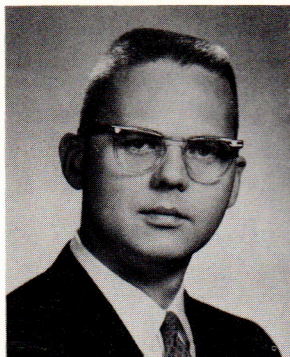
### CHEERLEADING COACH

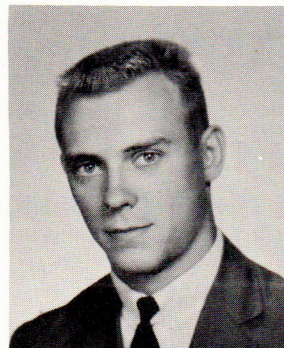
### TRAINER

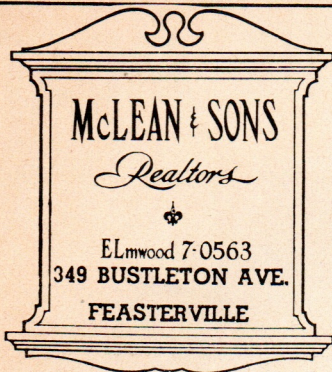

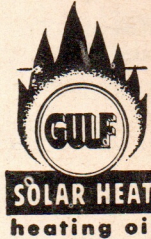
