TO REVIEW LAST WEEK'S VICTORY

One Down - nine to go. Coach John Petercuskie's eleven struck through the air - recovered a fumble for a touchdown - and - scored via a ten yard run to down the Bishop Egan "Eagles" for the fifth straight season in a row. A crowd of 10,000 fans journeyed to the Redskin camp for the opening game of the 1964 football season. Neshaminy's Winged-T offensive unit directed by Jimmy Colbert, a 170-pound Junior Quarterback rolled up 220 yards on the ground and 60 yards through the air while completing 3 of 9 passes.

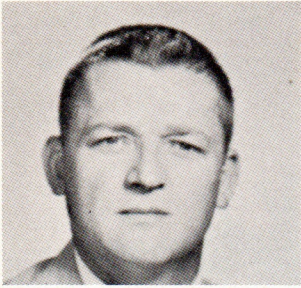
The Redskin defensive unit which held Egan to 106 yards on the ground and 56 yards on passing did an outstanding job, allowing the opponents only one clear threat . . . but no score. Two intercepted passes and three recovered fumbles enabled the Redskins to stay on top their opponents.
