

Sroba leading point race

Neshaminy High School's Joe Sroba has already equalled one Lower Bucks County football scoring record, and if he maintains his present pace, several others could also be in jeopardy.

On Saturday Sroba scored 38 points against Easton, to match the output of George School's Ron Hancox in 1969. The big day pushed Sroba's total point production to 50, tops in Lower Bucks.

Sroba's 16.6 points per game average is just slightly behind the 17.3 mark of Neshaminy's Bob Baxter in 1962. Baxter set the overall scoring mark of 191 points in that season.

Pennsbury's Dale Delise has also been scoring at a rapid rate. The Falcon running back has four touchdown runs and one TD punt return for a total of 30 points.

Bristol's Bob Delia. Archbishop Wood's Lonnie Manai, and Lower

Moreland's Mike Datoila are tied for the third spot with 20 points.

In the early stages of the season, Pennsbury's John Giordano has emerged as the top area kicker. Giordano has booted nine extra points and a pair of 25-yard field goals, to rank ninth in overall scoring.

Jenkintown's Paul Kershaw is the current passing leader. The Drakes' senior signal caller has completed 58 percent of his passes (29-of-51) for 529 yards and four touchdowns.

Neshaminy's Bob Grupp is a close second, statistically (19-of-36 for 481 yards), but has five touchdown passes to his credit. Bensalem Township's Bruce Reiprich and Woodrow Wilson's Bob Hinton have three TD passes apiece.

Sroba is the top pass receiver with four six-point receptions. Wilson's Bob Weller has been on the receiving end of all Hinton's scoring aeriels, and ranks second.

Neshaminy is the area's top of-

fensive team. The Redskins, who strive for balance, have 558 yards rushing and 481 yards passing for an overall figure of 1039. Jack Swartz's boys have a scoring average of 27.0 ppg. Jenkintown is second offensively with 782 yards, and Pennsbury is third with 706.

Pennsbury is the area's best at keeping the opposition in check. The defensive minded Falcons have held opponents to just 22 points in three games, have given up only 24 first downs, and have yielded only 184 total offensive yards on the average.
