LANGHORNE — Neshaminy

turned three second-half pass interceptions into touchdowns Friday night and a 25-14 win over Pennridge before 5,500. The three touchdowns came within five minutes to turn the game around.

Pennridge, making its first start, had a 14-6 lead at half. It evaporated quickly in the third period when the Redskins picked off two Paul Auckland passes and turned both into scores quickly.

Then on the first play of the fourth period Bart Smith intercepted another Auckland toss and raced it back 60 yards for a touchdown to ice the game. The Redskins evened their season record at 1-1.

Scott Kingsbauer, a slender end for Pennridge played the big role as the Rams geared for an upset in the early going. He scored with an Auckland pass which covered 75 yards to give Pennridge the lead.

Neshaminy matched that with a 49-yard drive climaxed when Bob Grupp threw a five-yard scoring pass to Steve Gale on a fourth-down play midway in the second period.

Kingsbauer intercepted a Grupp pass minutes later and raced it back 52 yards setting up Auckland's two-yard plunge in the last seconds of the period.

Neshaminy fumbled the ball

away yearly in the third period and then Kevin Fluck picked off one of Grupp's passes but the Rams couldn't cash in.

The Redskins came right back to pick off an Auckland pass — there were seven in all during the game — Grubb hit Joe Sroba for a 30-yard scoring pass.

Trailing for the first time Auckland went to the air again. On the third play Don Dripps intercepted at the Pennridge 28. Five plays later Len Barker went in from two yards out.
