

# Neshaminy Rips Freedom; Koch, Swartz Pace Win

Freedom fans had little to cheer about last night while the Patriots were being outclassed, outmanned and, ultimately outscored by visiting Neshaminy.

Andy Koch ran for two touchdowns and John Swartz threw for three more and a conversion as the Redskins scored in every period to scalp the injury-depleted Patriot troops 35-0.

The outcome represented more of Neshaminy's ability to grind out the necessary yardage on the ground, 218 yards, than gain any spectacular long runs or muster a fancy passing game.

Koch, the game's leading rusher with 70 yards on 14 carries, made his longest carry of 22 yards in the third period on the only reverse called by Swartz all night. His two touchdowns came on runs of one and two yards.

While Koch, Joe Sroba and Bruce Traneby did the brunt of the dull but effective running game, Swartz picked his pass timing a little more excitingly.

He hit one of three attempts in the first half finding end Bill Buckley clear in the corner of the end zone from eight yards out.

He tossed just three times after that. The first was a five-yard touchdown to Sroba, capping a 57-yard drive the first time the Redskins got the ball in the third quarter.

The next two occasions came in the waning minutes as Rich McIntyre put in a brief appearance to haul in a seven yarder and then a faked placement and little lob to Alex Wasilov for the last two points. Chris Bahr added the other three conversion points in four ties with his soccer-type booting.

Neshaminy took full advantage, however, of the breaks that came its way. The first-quarter score followed eight plays after a short Freedom punt gave them the ball at the Patriot 44. Koch had 21 of those yards including the final one-yard burst.

The next score followed Wasilov's fumble recovery at the Freedom 21 as Koch carried to the 10 and Swartz threw to Buckley.

Following the drive in the

third period which featured Koch's reverse to the 22, a personal foul penalty and a Swartz-to-Sroba aerial, Jim Seitz came up with the Redskins' second fumble recovery at the 19. Koch was in from the 2 five plays later.

And so it went in the last period as Jeff Shenfeld and Rich Rosenblatt sandwiched interceptions of poorly thrown Steve Crane passes around a Neshaminy fumble, all of which provided a little excitement.
