## Easton Downed By Neshaminy

Yesterday must have been Frustration Day for Easton's Red Rovers as powerful Neshaminy invaded Cottingham Stadium and walked away with a 28-6 Big Seven win.

The victory preserved the Redskins' record at 2-0 and kept them in a tie with Allen and Dieruff at 1-0 for the Big Seven lead.

Early in the first period, Neshaminy punter Chris Bahr unloaded and the ball rolled dead on the Easton six.

Four plays later, it was the Red Rovers turn to punt, but Tom Attinello never got his hands or feet on the ball. With a bad snap over Attinello's head, the ball rolled out of the end zone for a safety giving the visitors a 3-0 lead.

Easton then kicked from its own 20, but the ball rolled out of bounds, giving the Redskins possession on the Red Rover 40. Five plays later, Joe Srba grabbed a 30-yard pass from John Swartz for the score. Bahr kicked the first of three conversions for a 9-0 lead.

Following the kickoff, the Red Rover offense sputtered to a stop on its own 25 and it was time to punt again.

This time, the punt never took flight as it dribbled past Attinello and stopped at the five. Attinello tried to pick it up and run, but got nowhere and was downed by linebacker Tim Kelly.

On Neshaminy's first play, Andy Koch slanted off tackle and scored untouched. Bahr's kick gave the Redskins a 16-0 first quarter lead.

Neshaminy added another touchdown in the third quarter driving 60 yards in 12 plays as Swartz went over from the one.

In the final stanza, Easton got on the scoreboard as Odell Threadford ran a reverse from his own 14, drove up the left sideline and went in for the touchdowns. The two-point conversion try failed.

Easton had another scoring opportunity as they successfully

tried an onside kick and gained possession on the Neshaminy 46. The Red Rovers drove to the 24, but gave the ball up on downs as the game ended.
