Midway through the same period, Dale Forchetti returned a punt 68 yards to paydirt and Neshaminy gained its tie as soccer star Chris Bahr booted the extra point.

Forchetti's punt return was the only time throughout the game that Neshaminy entered Pennsbury's side of the 50-yard line. The closest the Falcons got to the Neshaminy goal in the second half was the 30-yard line as both teams excelled on defense.
