The 182-pound senior led in rush-ing with 389 yards and a 4.2 aver-age, in pass receiving with 13 catches good for 163 yards and two touchdowns, in scoring with 52 points, and in kickoff returns with aight for 159 words with eight for 158 yards. Quarterback Dick Hoak led total

offense with 396 passing yards and 284 rushing yards. He completed 25 or 46 passes for five touchdowns and averaged 4.3 yards rushing. Fulback Sam Sobczak edged Hoak for the No. 2 rushing spot with 287 yards and a 4.1 average. Captain Henry Oppermann gave Kerr a battle for pass receiving laurels. The lanky end caught 13 for 131 yards and a TD. Quarterbacks Galen Hall com-olled the most yards nassing with offense with 396 passing yards and
