## Serra, Priest head All-State team

PHILADELPHIA (AP) Quarterback Rich Bowen' of Serra Catholic and running back Ryan Priest of Mechanicsburg hightlight the 1981 Associated Press All-State Scholastic football team, announced Tuesday

The team was selected by AP member sports writers and sportscasters.

Bowen is so popular that boxes of mail from college recruiters have forced him to vacate his bedroom and sleep in the basement, according to his father, who also happens to be the young man's coach at the McKeesport school.

Priest, who missed a state career rushing record by only nine yards, also has scouts drooling.

Bowen has heard from the nation's leading colleges and universities, all interested in the passer who connected on 412 of 751 attempts for 2,020 yards during his high school career, including 92 of 146 for 1.350 vards this past season.

Pitt, Penn State, Georgia, Michigan, Notre Dame, Iowa, Ohio State, Michigan State, Miami (Fla.), North Carolina State, South Carolina, Boston College and UCLA are among the schools trying to entice Bowen their way. Bowen accounted for 15 touchdowns this season. including seven rushing, kicked 22 conversions and on defense intercepted four passes.

"He's just developing," claims his dad, Richard. The coach says his 6-foot-2, 190-pound son also is a top sprinter.

Priest gained 1,900 yards this season and 4,866 in his high school career, nine short of the recognized state record of 4.875 set by Mike Tracy of Marian Catholic last year.

Bowen and Priest are joined on the All-State first offensive team by ends Dean DiMidio of West Chester East and Sean Sullivan from Cardinal O'Hara (Philadelphia): linemen Scott Saylor of Whitehall, Tim Scannell of State College, Dennis Borcky of Chichester, Bob Buczkowski of Gateway and Todd Moules of Wilkes-Barre Meyers; running backs Matt Stennett of Shaler Area and Jon Green of Monongahela Valley Catholic.

The first defensive unit consists of ends Brian Sleverling of Harborcreek and Wayne Blasingame of Martin Luther King (Philadelphia); linemen Bob Schilken of Mt. Lebanon, Eric Alwine of Greensburg Catholic and Leroy Schannauer of Wilson: linebackers Bob White of Freeport, Don Graham of Brentwood and Bob Ontko of Wyoming Valley, and backs Chris Collins of Chartiers Valley. Mark McWilliams of Coatesville and Bob Howard of Langley

Stennett carried the ball over 200 times for almost 1,200 yards and scored 10 touchdowns. His three year career shows 3.500 vards gained with 31 touchdowns. He, too, is on the recruiting list of the likes of Alabama, Oklahoma, Pitt, Penn State, UCLA and Notre Dame

Green gained 4,719 yards in his career, including 2,020 for Monongahela Valley (10-1) this season. He's been the leading ground gainer and scorer in the powerful WPIAL the last two seasons. He too, is being buried with recruiting mail from throughout the country.
