LANGHORNE — Neshaminy High's Redskins (6-0-1) sprang an ambush on Altoona's roving Mountain Lions from Pennsylvania's interior here last night and danced a joyous 27-6 victory celebration over their intra-state rival.

Neshaminy's Jim Colbert was just too much for the visitors to handle. The slim 6-2, 185 pound

senior accounted for three of the Redskins' four touchdowns.

Colbert's performance picked up 115 yards on 23 attempts.

Altoona was considered to be one of the toughest teams in the state.

Many thought the Mountain Lions would snap Neshaminy's 18 game unbeaten skein. But Neshaminy made it No. 49.

"We sure didn't think we were going to do as well as we did," remarked Neshaminy mentor

a break right off the bat. George Nolte's opening kickoff crazily bounded down to the 21 yard line. When the ball squirted away from an Altoona player Neshaminy's Harry Hoffman bounced on it.

Colbert, Barr Excel

Runs of five and 11 yards by Colbert and Jerry Barr, respectively, put the ball on the five. Three running plays moved it to the half yard line. Colbert then pushed his way over left guard for the game's first tally. Nolte split the uprights to make it 7-0.

Altoona came right back to march 74 yards in nine plays for a TD. Quarterback Walt Beatty hit flanker Dick Frasca with a pass on the four. Beatty then tip-toed into the end zone. The play covered 37 yards. A run for the point after fell short.

Lions Halted On 4

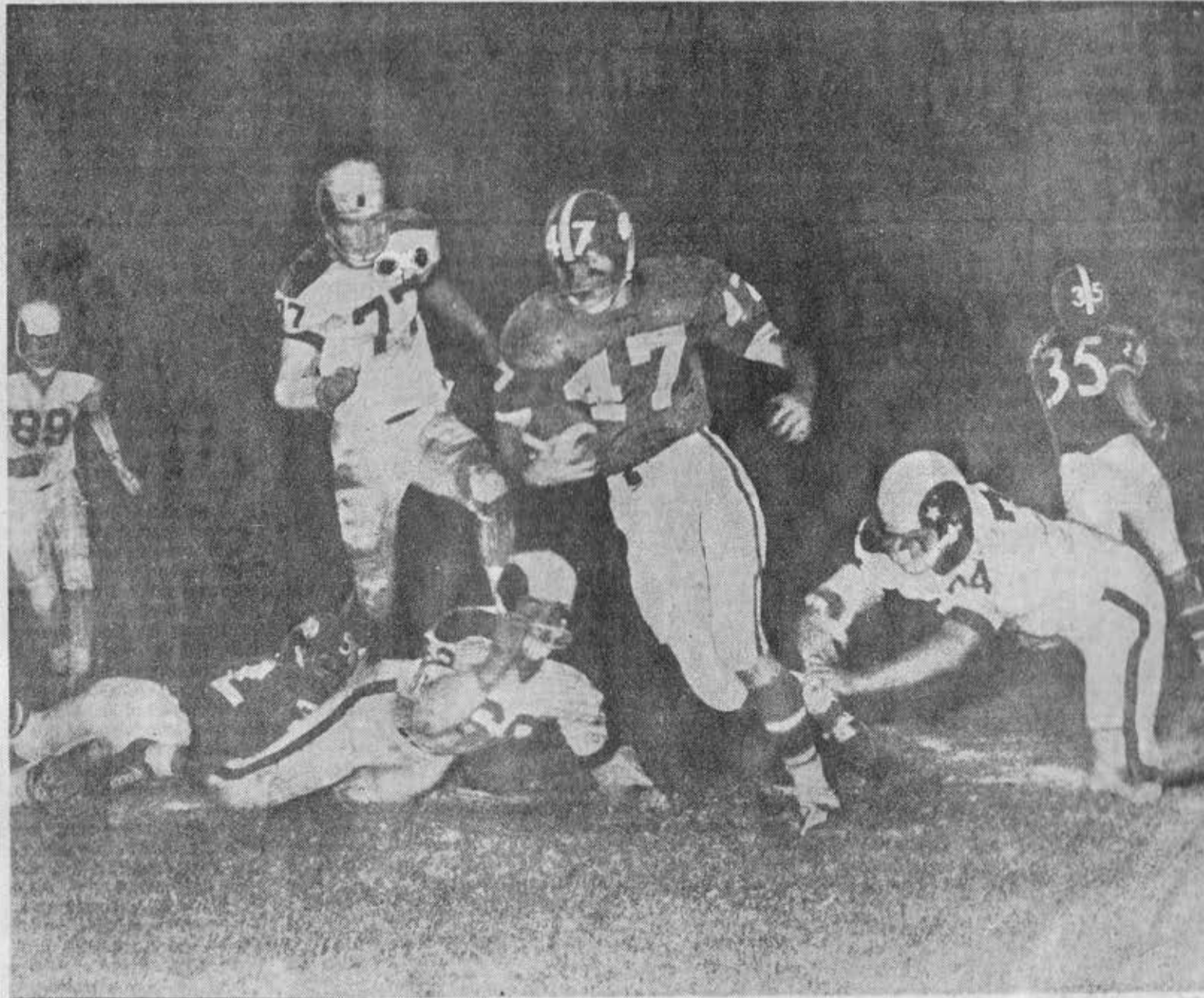
At the beginning of the second period the Neshaminy defense halted the Mountain Lions on the Neshaminy four yard line to stop a threat.

With 1:49 left in the first half, Barr intercepted an Altoona pass at midfield and returned it to the visitors' 13.

After a six yard pickup by Colbert, the Redskin quarterback swept around left end for his second touchdown. Nolte made it 14-6.

Take Kickoff

The winners took the second half kickoff and drove 53 yards for a touchdown. On fourth down, Colbert took it in from one foot out. Nolte's boot was wide.
