Eleven high schools in Pennsylvania shared in glory today as the 1959 UPI All-Pennsylvania High School football team was released. Don Caum, flashy quarterback for Central Dauphin, was the top pick in the backfield.

The Lower Bucks County Football League came in for an unexpected surprise when Neshaminy High's Harry Schuh, a junior, was named to the second team as a fullback.

John Price of Wilkes - Barre Meyers, champions of the Wyoming Valley Conference, was given the first team fullback spot.
