

Neshaminy Defeats Tennent, 37-0

 In a Lower Bucks League game at Neshaminy the Redskins blasted the Wm. Tennent Panthers 37 to 0. The Redskins used a superb defensive effort which included five interceptions and one safety to notch the victory. Neshaminy head coach Jack Swartz summed it up with "our defense did the job; they deserved that one." Neshaminy next week faces Pennsbury for the league championship deciding game.

The Redskins first score came in the first quarter when junior Bruce Traney

went 45 yards on a beautifully executed draw play. The kick for the PAT was missed.

March 64 Yards

Midway through the second period Neshaminy marched 64 yards in 10 plays for their score. Senior Andy Koch got the call and charged in from the two yard line for the score. Senior Chris Bahr kicked the point after to give the Skins a 13 point lead.

Just less than five minutes later the Redskins scored for the final time in the first half when Koch capped off a 53 yard drive by plowing in from the five yardline for the score. Once again Bahr

split the uprights to make the PAT good.

Punt Return

In the middle of the third quarter Redskin halfback Dale Forchetti took a punt from Tennent's Mike Simonous and raced back 63 yards for a touchdown. It was a thrilling runback and Forchetti broke several tackles to get away. Bahr once more kicked the extra point.

Near the end of the third period with Tennent on its own four yard line Neshaminy's Mike Emanuel blitzed through the middle of Tennent's line to drop Tennent quarterback Keith Conner in the endzone for a safety.

Neshaminy's final score came in the fourth quarter. This time the Redskins used an interception by John Frederick who brought the ball back to Neshaminy's own 18 yard line. From there it took the Redskins just three plays to go in for the score. Junior Pete Scupakus bulled his way in from the five yard line for the six points. John Swartz then passed to senior Alex

Wasilou for the two point conversion.
