

Four Area Players Listed On AP All-State Squad

(Ed. Note — Four area players, Penns Manor's Dave Goodyear, Punxy's Roger Raybuck, Apollo-Ridge's Alan Ridenour and Indiana High's Skip Spadafora were mentioned on the Associated Press All-State team released today.)

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Running back Matt Suhey of State College High made the Associated Press All-State Scholastic Football Team for the third straight year, while New Castle placed three players on the first team announced Wednesday.

Bethlehem Catholic's fine team was honored with three positions on the 33-player squad, as was Parkland, Upper St. Clair, like New Castle a WPIAL power, placed two on the All-Star team.

The All-State team was selected on the basis of recommendations from sports writers, broadcasters and telecasters and college coaches and recruiters. Most of the three offensive and defensive units are highly-sought college prospects.

New Castle placed guard Bill Hemming on the first offensive team, and tackle Mark Latsko and linebacker Bruce Clarke on the first defensive unit. Parkland choices were offensive tackle Ricky Bott on the first team, center Bert Doward defensive tackle Denny Gerhart on the second, Bethlehem Catholic got running back Mike Guman on the first unit, linebacker Mike Brown on the second defensive team, and Gu-

man as a third team defensive back. Upper St. Clair placed center Mike Kramer on the first team and defensive tackle Kurt Breckbill on the third team.

In addition to the New Castle, Bethlehem, Parkland and Upper St. Clair selections, here's how the first offensive and defensive units look: **Offense**, ends Jim Karcergis of Palisades and Ed Bugno of West Scranton; tackle Frank Case of Central Bucks, guard Bob Smart of Plum, quarterback Wayne Gigante of Canevin and running back Larry Reid of Cardinal Dougherty, (defense) ends Tom Temple of McKeesport and Steve Fedell of North Hills, tackle Al Pisula of Westmoreland, linebackers George Schechterly of Berwick and Larry Shepard of Kittanning, and backs Corry Meade of Dunmore, Len Gallo of Penn Hills, Mike Mayock of Haverford School and Dave Bordner of Shikellamy.

Suhey was a walk-in for his third nomination. The State College back, who missed 1½ games, gained 1,509 yards on 240 carries and scored 17 touchdowns. He also caught three TD passes and threw for one. In his spare time, he punted for close to a 40-yard average and played defensive halfback. In three years, the 208-pound Suhey gained 4,557 yards on 721 carries and scored 57 TDs.

The 200-pound Guman also was a jack-of-all trades master of many, at Bethlehem Catholic. He ran for 800 yards, caught 10 passes for 100, returned punts and kickoffs for 500, kicked field goals and extra points, completed 10 halfback passes, scored 70 points, and also played All-State defense.

Reid made first team even though he broke his hand after six games. The 210-pound runner is one of the most sought after prospects by the colleges. He gained 1,250 yards and scored 15 TDs in those six games for Cardinal Dougherty.

Karcergis might be considered a "sleeper" by some, but not where he played football. The 6-foot-3, 191 pounder

caught 43 passes for 1,026 yards and 14 touchdowns. He scored 107 points total.

On defense, Clarke from New Castle was considered the most valuable player in the WPIAL AAA competition.

"East to the Atlantic, North to Canada, West to the Pacific and South to the Rio Grande, they all want Bruce," says New Castle coach Lindy Lauro of his 237-pound linebacker. Joe Moore, Upper St. Clair coach, said Clarke would be a starter in college as a freshman.
