

4 Ches-Mont Players Make All-State Team

Four members of teams in the Ches-Mont Football League were named to the 1969 Associated Press All-State Scholastic Football Team. Three of those honored received honorable mention while the fourth was named to the third team.

Highest honors for a Ches-Mont League player went to Jim Joe, Coatesville back who

broke the league scoring in the Thanksgiving Day game against Downingtown. Joe was named to the AP third team.

Selected for honorable mention were Frank Robinson of the champion Spring-Ford team; Mark Gear of Phoenixville and Herman Robinson of Coatesville.

Robinson and Gear honored during the season by the Schuylkill Valley Touchdown clubs were given honorable mention as a tackle and a linebacker, respectively.

Herman Robinson was selected for his play as a linebacker.

Quarterback Steve Joachim of Haverford and Eric McDowell's Jeff Davis were top choices on the 1969 Associated Press All-State Scholastic Football Team, announced today.

The team was selected with the help of sportswriters, sportscasters, and high school and college coaches in an effort to come as close as possible to rewarding the best football players in the state.

Some "sleepers" were uncovered and, unfortunately, some good ones probably were overlooked, despite an effort to blanket the huge field of candidates.

Joachim wound up a three-year career at Haverford with 273 completed passes of 450 thrown for 4,656 yards and 62 touchdowns. His touchdown passes are believed to be a state record. There were at least a dozen first-rate quarterbacks available, but Joachim was rated tops by most observers.

Davis wound up a fantastic career at Erie McDowell, rushing for a total of 3,045 yards on 546 carries, an average of 5.57 per carry. He caught 31 passes, intercepted 5 and returned 56 kicks. All told, the 180-pound back accounted for 4,701 yards in 27 games.

Joining Joachim and Davis in the backfield are Gary Diminick of Mt. Carmel and Doug Kotar of Canon-McMillan. Diminick, a 160-pounder, scored 220 points this season, erasing the record of 218 which has stood since 1948. He scored 34 touchdowns and averaged 9.9 yards per carry. Kotar gained 801 yards on 111 carries and scored 9 touchdowns for Canon-McMillan. In his three-year career he gained 1,418 yards on 234 carries.

The ends on the offensive team are Dave Jagdmann of Gateway and John Smurda of Allentown Dieruff. Jagdmann caught 17 passes for 463 yards and was a solid blocker, while Smurda caught 33 passes for 437 yards and 4 TDs. Randy Crowder of Farrell and Baldwin's Dave Wannstedt are rated standouts at the tackles, while Crowder's teammate, Alva Cheeks and Tom Coombs of Ridley Township received the most support at guards. Mark Brennerman of West York won a close contest for the center position.

The defensive unit is packed with big, strong, quick youngsters, whose telephones and doorbells are ringing with college scouts and coaches. Altoona's John Withers and Meley Daviston of Duquesne, a two-way player, won the end positions. John Kuster of Gateway at 230 and Jim Boyle of Philadelphia's Bishop Egan are the tackles, while the four linebacking spots went to Terry Factor of Highlands, Wayne Thornhill of Elwood City, also a two-plateau player; Tom Ross of Beaver Falls and Pete Good of Chambersburg. Ross weighs in at 251 pounds.

Defensive secondary jobs went to Stan Ostrowski of Canon-McMillan, Tom Williams of Allentown Central Catholic and Butler's Bob Kelly. All members of the first offensive and defensive are seniors.
