Goimarac, 6-3 and 225, helped Charleroi to the title with his excellent all-around play. He was rated by many college scouts as the outstanding lineman in the WPIAL.

Kelly and Searer are about the same size. Kelly, a good pass receiver and safety man, at 6-2, 187, is two inches taller and two pounds heavier than Searer, who won honors with his standout linebacking. Kelly was another outstanding WPIAL player.

Hard to Move

Bednar, 6-2 and 215, was rated the top lineman in northeastern Pennsylvania, Generalovich hoisted Farrell, also of the WPIAL, to eight victories in nine games. At 6-3, 210, he proved a hard man to move.

Burns is the most sought after player in the Philadelphia area.

He's 6-1 and 200. Leeson and Gutshall, both members of WPIAL schools, did a Herculean job in cranking out plenty of mileage. The 6-foot, 192-pound Leeson averaged 230 yards a game for nine games and scored 25 touchdowns. He was rated the top running back in western Pennsylvania. Gutshall, 5-10 and 175,
