

Shimoskie, Rissmiller Gain AP 2nd Team

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Diminutive Don Caum, who rose from a third string all-state quarterback in 1958 to lead Central Dauphin to a 9-1 record this year, heads the All-Pennsylvania scholastic football team announced Wednesday by the Associated Press.

Northampton's Lou Shimoskie and Easton's Ray Rissmiller gained second team berths while Easton's Charlie Weaver was selected to the third team. Twelve Lehigh Valley area players were given honorable mention.

Shimoskie, 205-pound senior guard, led Northampton to an undefeated season which extended the Konkrete Kids' unbeaten string to 17 games. The team co-captain was earlier selected to the "Big 33."

Rissmiller, a tackle, and Weaver, a speedy halfback, paced Easton to a 9-1 record. Rissmiller was a standout on both offense and defense. Weaver's 30-yard run sent Central Dauphin to its lone defeat, 7-6.

WPIAL Dominates

The WPIAL, a powerful conference in the state, dominates the group with five players, including guard Pete Goimarac of Charleroi, the WPIAL AA champion.

Opposite Goimarac is Lancaster's Paul Feder. These three were the top choices.

The rest of the big, mobile line, which averages 200 pounds, is made up of ends Jack Searer of Lewistown and Jim Kelly of Clairton; tackles Brian Generalovich of Farrell and George Bednar of Kingston Catholic, and center Bill Burns of West Catholic of Philadelphia.

Caum, a 155-pound bundle of dynamite who passed and rushed for 1,119 yards and scored eight touchdowns, sparks a lightning-

ord, made the best team showing by placing three men among the top vote getters. Center George Bechtold was named to the third team and quarterback Frank Hershey received honorable mention. Feder, a 190-pound offensive guard and defensive linebacker, bolstered Lancaster's front wall which limited its opponents to only 26 points.

Goimarac, 6-3 and 225, helped Charleroi to the title with his excellent all-around play. He was rated by many college scouts as the outstanding lineman in the WPIAL.

Kelly and Searer are about the same size. Kelly, a good pass receiver and safety man, at 6-2, 187, is two inches taller and two pounds heavier than Searer, who won honors with his standout linebacking. Kelly was another outstanding WPIAL player.

Hard to Move

Bednar, 6-2 and 215, was rated the top lineman in northeastern Pennsylvania. Generalovich hoisted Farrell, also of the WPIAL, to eight victories in nine games. At 6-3, 210, he proved a hard man to move.

Burns is the most sought after player in the Philadelphia area. He's 6-1 and 200.

Leeson and Gutshall, both members of WPIAL schools, did a Herculean job in cranking out plenty of mileage. The 6-foot, 192-pound Leeson averaged 230 yards a game for nine games and scored 25 touchdowns. He was rated the top running back in western Pennsylvania. Gutshall, 5-10 and 175, averaged better than 125 yards rushing per game.

Wise scored 121 points and made 15 touchdown runs from scrimmage ranging from 10 to 87 yards.
