

Bethlehem Liberty Snaps Neshaminy's Streak, 22-6

Bethlehem Liberty High knocked visiting Neshaminy from the unbeaten ranks Friday night as the Redskins dropped a 22-6 decision in a Big Seven Conference game played in 34 degree weather before a capacity crowd of 16,000. It was the sixth victory for unbeaten Liberty.

After a scoreless first half, Liberty grabbed a 6-0 lead on a 39 yard run by Mitch Lukevics early in the third period. A 24-yard return with an interception set-up a one-yard plunge by Lukevics for Liberty's second TD. Rich Wescoe's conversion run gave the host team a 14-0 edge entering the fourth quarter.

Liberty upped its lead to 22-0 as Bob Ruyak scored from the one after a 14-yard return with another interception by Fritz Lukevics ran for the conversion points. Neshaminy, which had won its first five games, got its touchdown with 2:18 left to play on a 29-yard pass from reserve quarterback Pete Cordelli to Bill Buckley.

Dennis Coleman wound up with six touchdown passes while Arnold Coleman and Mackrey each scored three touchdowns. Mackrey also kicked four extra points and
