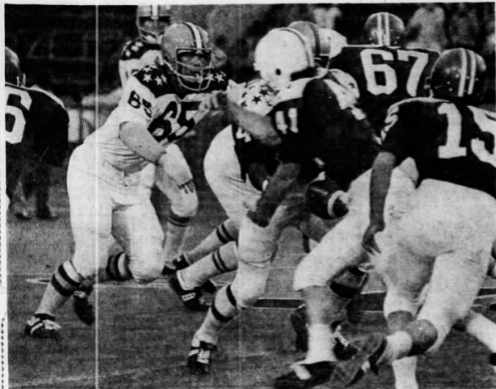


# Scott's Passes Pace Suburban, 31-8

## Does He or Doesn't He? Only the Quarterback Knows

The Suburban All-Stars, led by Ridley High's Eric Scott, rallied in the second half for four touchdowns to defeat the City All-Stars, 31-8, in the annual MS Hope Chest football classic Saturday night at Franklin Field.

After the City stars had marched 80 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter and led, 8-3 at halftime, the Suburbans, coached by Stan Freedman, moved ahead on Scott's exceptional passing.

The Suburban team scored two touchdowns in the third period, Scott going over on a keeper from the 1 and later passing to Gary Mitchell from the 15.

In the fourth quarter, Suburban pushed over two quick TDs. A beautiful aerial from Scott to Rick Marquart, of Haverford High, for 12 yards ended a 45-yard drive of six plays.

A few minutes later, Steve Frith of Springfield (Montco), caught a fumble in the air on the 19 and ran to the City 8. Four plays later, Tom Shuman of Pottstown, heaved a pass to Ralph Farina of Haverford into the end zone.

Chris Bahr (Neshaminy) kicked a 26-yard field goal and four extra points for the victors of a game played before an estimated 6000.

The City All-Stars went 80 yards in 10 plays for their lone touchdown in the second quarter. The key plays were passes by Warren Mays, All-Public from Frankford High, to Bruce Shepherdson (Roman Catholic High) and Tom Carpenter (Frankford) and to Rasheed Travis-Bey (Bartram High). The touchdown was recorded on 9-yard off tackle slant by Ken Haigh (Father Judge).

A pitchout from Mays to Travis-Bey accounted for the two extra points.

The duel between the two outstanding quarterbacks of the area found Scott on top.

# West Beats East, 33-28, on TD Pass With 0:31 Left In Coaches' Game

LUBBOCK, Tex. (UPI). — Chuck Hixson of Southern Methodist, subbing for Heisman Trophy winner Jim Plunkett, tossed a 23-yard touchdown pass to Nebraska's Joe Orndua with 31 seconds remaining Saturday to give the West a 35-28 victory in the 11th annual Coaches

Hixson entered the game with two minutes on the clock and the West trailing, 28-26, after Alabama quarterback Scott Hunter had dashed across from the three for an apparent East victory.

Hixson moved the West 57 yards in five plays, all but three yards in the air.

The East led the see-saw battle 14-7 at halftime and increased that margin to 21-7 early in the third quarter.

However, Plunkett, No. 1 draft choice from Stanford, passed the West back on

three touchdowns in 11 minutes for a 26-21 lead going into the final quarter.
