
Scott's Passes Pace Suburban, 31-8

LUBBOCK, Tex. (UPD). -Chuck Hixson of Southern Methodist, subbing for Heisman Trophy winner Jim Plunkett, tossed a 23-yard touchdown pass to Nebraska's Joe Orduna with 31 sec onds remaining Saturday to give the West a 35-28 victory in the 11th annual Coaches Hixson entered the game with two minutes on the clock and the West trailing, 28-26, after Alabama quarterback Scott Hunter had dashed across from the three for an apparent East victory.

Hixson moved the West 57 yards in five plays, all but three yards in the air.

After the City stars had marched 80 vards for a touchdown in the second quarter and led, 8-3 at halftime, the Suburbans, coached by Stan Freedman, moved ahead on Scott's exceptional passing.
