## McDowell's Mike Bartoszek Leads 1970 All-State Football Squad

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Liberty Bethlehem's Mike Hartenstein, Eric McDowell's Mike Bartoszek, Laurel Highlands' Bill DeShields and Chambersburg's Ron Etter have been selected on the 1970 Associated Press All-State Football Team, announced today.

Hartenstein and Bartoszek are offensive ends and linebackers. Etter a two-way tackle, and De

Shields an offensive and defensive back. All are big, strong, quick youngsters who are being sought by most of the major college football schools.

Other first team offensive stars voted to the team by sportswriters and sportscasters throughout the state are tackle

Tim Miller of Mt. Lebanon, guards Ralph Perri of Butler and Mike Axe of Lancaster, center Mark Schwears of North Allegheny, quarterback Chuck Florante of New Castle, and backs Paul Melzer of Springfield (Montgomery County), and Dennis Laws of Owen J. Roberts (Potterstown).

The defensive team in addition to Hartenstein, Bartoszek, Etter and DeShields, consists of ends Greg Iles of Martinsburg Central and Jim Bradley of Bishop McCort (Johnstown), tackle Andre Tennessee of Cardinal Dougherty (Philadelphia) and backs Eric Scott of Ridley, Rich Kaminsky of Kiski Area and Doug Plank of Norwin.

Hartenstein, a 6-foot-3, 230 pounder, caught 21 passes, scored 6 touchdowns, and kicked 21 extra points. But his real offensive value to Liberty Bethlehem was his blocking on offense.

Liberty Bethlehem had two 1,000-yard-plus running backs thanks to Hartenstein's blocking. Hartenstein runs the 40-yard dash in 4.9 and is a track and basketball star. He also was the key man on defense.

Bartoszek, 6-4 and 205 pounds, caught 21 passes for 410 yards and scored 8 TDs. He led the team in tackles from his middle linebacker post and punted for a 39 yard average. He also was a kickoff specialist. "All the major schools are approaching him," says his coach.

DeShields, a 5-10, 185-pound halfback, scored 15 touchdowns, 10 of them on runs of over 60 yards. He totaled 96 points, ran for 1,390 yards in 173 attempts for an 8-yard average and was just as tough from a defensive halfback post. Coach Fred Botti says of DeShields, "He's the best halfback I've ever seen...fabulous, any superlative you want to use."

Etter did it all for Chambersburg from his tackle spot, opening holes on offense and terrorizing the opposition from his defensive tackle position.

Chuck Florante was adjudged the best quarterback in the state and this was a year for good signalcallers. The 6-1, 195-pounder completed 80 of 145 passes for 1,412 yards and 17 touchdowns in 10 games. A drop back passing type, Florante is the object of major college recruiters. He played in the same league as Joe Namath and Terry Hanratty and in the opinion of area experts he is as good or better than either one.

Owen J. Roberts' Dennis Laws is a perfect running back for Florante. The 5-9, 165-pounder gained 2,005 yards in 11 games,

scoring 176 points. Roberts' coach, Henry Bernat, says, "I don't think there is a high school back in the country who can make a quick cut at top speed without the slightest let-down as well as Laws."

Jim Bradley made 104 tackles for Greater Johnstown, a record for the school, and set new marks in pass catching and yardage gained receiving. Butler's Perri, a 6-3, 205-pound 17-year-old, switched from offensive end this year to do a job at offensive guard.

Schwears is disadvantaged by his size—160 pounds—but he has great desire. Kaminsky didn't play in two games due to illness but showed enough class to warrant both first team defense and second team offensive recognition. He scored 10 TDs and gained 789 yards.

Axe is a strong, mobile youngster who blocks well. Melzer gained 1,710 yards for an 11.7-yard average, scoring 23 touchdowns on unbeaten Springfield (10-0). Tennessee was a versatile two-way tackle.

Scott could be better known for his quarterbacking deeds—14 TD passes and 35 per cent completion average—but this real value is on defense.

Emanuel is rated one of the best linebackers in recent years in the eastern half of the state. Stesser was part of a Bishop Egan defensive backfield that allowed only two touchdowns through the air. Stoneback is another of the strong, silent types.
