

BRISTOL HIGH IS VICTOR IN GAME WITH LANGHORNE

Local Eleven Wins Contest On
Opponents' Field by Score
of 7 to 6

FIRST HALF WAS SLOW

Team Showed New Spirit At
Beginning of Second
Half of Contest

Bristol High defeated Langhorne High 7 to 6 in a decisive battle fought at the latter's field yesterday. During the first half it seemed as if Bristol would lose the game because of its inactiveness, but the second half brought the boys with a new spirit with which they were influenced by their coach's talk.

Bristol received the ball in the first half but before Pleo could recover the ball after he had touched it a Langhorne fellow dived on it and gave the opposing team first down. Langhorne tried several forward passes which were completed beautifully, starring Carter, their fullback, who caught two passes and Haefner, right end. Having a clear field Haefner made a 40 yard run for a touchdown, scoring six points for Langhorne.

Raccagno received on the kick off, running about twenty yards before any man could break through the almost perfect screen which was formed in front of him. Then Tranotti began to plunge the line which gained several first downs for Bristol. Tranotti lost several yards in a play giving Langhorne the ball. The rival team again heaved forward passes which again proved to their credit. Davis caught two more, once making a twenty yard run down the field but was stopped by Lafferty. When Bristol got possession of the ball no harm could be done. That ended the first half which was almost uneventful for Bristol.

The Bristol eleven did not play a good game of football in the first half. The players appeared to be slow, weary, and did not seem to take any interest whatsoever in the game. But the second half was an entirely different story. The players came out displaying their changed attitude, ability, and activeness on the gridiron field. They routed the Langhorne eleven unmercifully.

Bristol's line was changed somewhat in the next half. Britton took Smoyer's place. Dundee, who in the first half had received an injury to his left eye, occupied his usual position, and Tranotti, who was also out of the game during most of the first half, now took the quarterback position.

Langhorne received this time but it wasn't long before Bristol got the ball when Langhorne could not get through the stonewall formed by the Bristol line. Tranotti started to march up the field near Langhorne's goal by plunging the line successfully. Bristol gave Langhorne blow after blow, forcing Langhorne to retreat time and time again.

Raccagno received the ball and was stopped several inches short of the goal. He must have unconsciously crawled and shoved the ball over the goal for Bristol was penalized five yards. On the last down Bristol tried a forward pass which was intercepted by Langhorne.

Langhorne kicked out of danger. In the next few plays Bristol tried their luck again at heaving passes. Gaffney received one, scoring first down. Tranotti plunged the line again more successfully than his other attempts. Langhorne received the ball and kicked out of danger. Gaffney touched the ball but before he picked it up a Langhorne man dived on it, giving them first down. Langhorne could not accomplish anything against Bristol's line. Bristol's ball. Tranotti threw a forward to Lafferty gaining first down for Bristol. Another pass was heaved to Lafferty who ran 20 yards, evading several men for a touchdown. Lafferty again starred for Bristol when he kicked over the goal, making the score 7-6 in favor of Bristol. After the kick-off Langhorne again tried their luck
