

PERKASIE WINS FROM LANGHORNE 33 TO 19

Final Athletic Event Under P. H. S. Colors. Basket Ball Teams of Perkasio and Sellersville Will Be Merged and Play Under Consolidated Colors.

Perkasie High passed out of the picture as a contender in sports among High Schools in this district, Friday, with a decisive victory over Langhorne High School gridgers; score 33 to 19.

The game marked the closing of the football season. All future athletic events will be played under the Sellersville-Perkasie Consolidated colors.

The victory Friday gave Perkasio a decided edge in the season's contests. In the eight game schedule the locals won five times, tied twice and only once did they bow to defeat. The record of the '29 team is the best made here in years.

The locals, outweighed in practically every position, put up a wonderful game.

Perkasie took the kick-off and after a series of plays, Pritchard carried the ball within a few yards of the goal and Johnny Hoffmeister completed the score on the next play. Another six-pointer was added and each time the extra point was registered which gave the locals a 14 to 0 edge at the end of the first period.

Langhorne opened up an aerial offensive in the second period and the success is indicated in two goals registered during that period.

Perkasie came back with a six-pointer in the third and added two more together with an extra point in the final period. Langhorne scored a goal and an extra point in the final period.
