Neshaminy High School's football team had a date with victory. The Redskins "flirted" with success last night but were held down at the last moment.

Neshaminy was left on the doorstep when William Allen High School of Allentown defeated them in the fourth period to get a 19-19 deadlock in the

Canaries Explode
The 'Skins of Coach Tom McHugh were on the threshold of winning before the Canaries exploded for 13 points mid-way in the final chapter.

The stalemate left Neshaminy with a 0-1-1 Big Six record and an overall mark of 0-2-2. Allen limped away from Heartbreak Ridge with a 1-0-1 loop ledger and a 2-0-1 reading in all games.

Neshaminy played inspired football in a game spiced with an aerial attack supplied by both sides which had the crowd buzzing.

12-0 Lead
The 'Skins rolled out to a 12-0 lead early in the second period on the thread - the - needle passing of senior Ernie Forchetti, a 6-0, 166-pound quarterback. Frank DeMezza, a 6-0, 182-pound

Neshaminy, thirsting to celebrate a win, raised the count to 19-6 on the second play of the fourth period. Forchetti scored on a three-yard run through the line.

Allen Gets Rolling
Allen, which rallied from a 13-0 score a week ago against Pennsbury to pull off 20-13 conquest, unloaded a power in the next seven minutes. The Canaries bulldozed 69 yards, with Larry Clymer going the last four lengths, to make it 19-13. The clock showed 7:19 left.

With 5:03 on the scoreboard the Canaries took the ball on their own 47-yard stripe. A running play netted nothing but Radcliffe, a 6-0, 180-pound senior, uncorked a bomb right down the center of the field. Lee Clymer (5-9, 160) caught the pigskin on the 15-yard line, broke away from two Neshaminy defenders, and sprinted into the end zone to complete a 53-yard pass - run combination.

Radcliffe's extra point boot went wide and it was 19-19.

McHugh felt Neshaminy is still moving forward despite the tie. "It was a furious football game. It was a see-saw battle. Craig Johns did some fine run-

Allen's other long distance strike cost Neshaminy the victory. It was the 53-yarder from Radcliffe to Lee Clymer with 4:46 remaining in the collision. Neshaminy had a drive go-
