Well Conditioned Miller Eager To Outrun South

Deron Miller has enjoyed the past couple weeks; talking football again, playing aside some of the best athletes in the county, running post patterns and tracking down the running back from his defensive end spot. But he won't be so disappointed when he can wake on Saturday morning and not have to worry about making a bedtime up to Buckingham for practice.

"It's been a grind," admitted Miller, who will be playing both ways this Friday night when the lights at "Poppy" Yoder field shine down on the Bucks County All-Star football game. "I get up at 4, have to be at work by 7 (o'clock). I'm working construction this summer. After I'm done with work, it's been over to practice, then I don't get home until 6:30 or 7 — by then I'm totally dead."

The practices, which run for more than two hours each afternoon and on Saturday morning, have been anything but light from the day they started. If one didn't know better, the workouts would more like basic training.

"It took me about two or three days to get into the swing of things," said the 6-foot-4-inch Miller, who will be setting up again in the middle of August when the Villanova University football camp opens. "The (Coach Chuck Rocconi) didn't waste any time. I'll tell you one thing — we'll be in shape. Let's just say by the end of practice you're dead. Night after night, we've been doing these things like great drills, up-down, running and jumping over the (tackling) dummies. And we have to run from station to station. Then at the end of practice we have what coach calls the fourth quarter drill."

The fourth quarter drill is only part of what has been a rugged couple of weeks of practice. The group has bumped helmets from the outset, as Rocconi has attempted to coordinate some of the finest football talent in the northern part of the county into a well-drilled

team for Friday's confrontation. Miller, for one, thinks his squad will be a difficult one to stop.

"The offense is just awesome," said the tight end, who was tabbed as second team All-Bucks-Most after the past season. "I'm really looking forward to playing with that group. Kevin Ward (from CB West) is really a super player, and we've been working well together. In fact, I think he kind of likes to throw to me. At least that's the way it's been so far."

Miller could get the start at offense on Friday in the 6 p.m. clash for the
