

# About 2300 Pupils Enrolled at Neshaminy

## Necessary to Transfer Some Children from One School To Another Building

LANGHORNE, Sept. 11 — The school year in the Neshaminy School District opened with approximately 2300 pupils and a faculty of more than 80 members. The schools in certain areas have been very crowded while those in other areas have had a lesser number of pupils than was anticipated, consequently it has become necessary to transfer pupils from one school to another in order to more nearly equalize enrollment.

"We realize that this is disconcerting to children and parents but from an educational point of view it is the only possible solution to our problem. The areas which have experienced the largest enrollment increase are Hulmeville, Parkland, and Feasterville. Penndel has absorbed the overflow of pupils from Hulmeville and Parkland," said an official.

"The Siles school has taken the overflow from Feasterville. In order to accommodate the large influx of pupils in the early elementary grades it has been necessary to establish a temporary school at the Country Club in Langhorne where grades one and three are housed. Other temporary quarters that are being used this year are the Soby Post American Legion building and the Fire House in
