

# Allen Bounces Back in Last Period To Gain 19-19 Tie With Neshaminy

LANGHORNE — It looked like somebody told Allen this was Neshaminy's year to play patsy, and for three quarters the Canaries seemed to believe it.

But Allen, which Coach Fritz Halfacre calls "a team that plays strictly on desire," came alive in the fourth period and earned a hard-fought 19-19 tie with the Redskins before nearly 7,000 fans.

Allen, undefeated and with everything to lose, trailed 19-6, with only 11 minutes left. But the Canaries bounced back by scoring two touchdowns and had the ball two more times as their defense stiffened. The latter two threats were spoiled by pass interceptions.

Neshaminy looked like anything but the same team which gained only 20 yards on the ground against Easton just last week while giving up 266. The Redskins who still do not have a victory in 1966, had Allen on the ropes until the end.

But the way in which the Canaries fought back to tie was spectacular, to say the least. They drove 69 yards on 10 plays for one touchdown and less than three minutes later, scored another with one of their patented passing bombs.

Larry and Lee Clymer, who started in the defensive secondary for Allen last year, but were converted to halfbacks this season, capped the march.

Larry skirted right end with three men in front of him to score from the 4, and Lee, running on a bad ankle, hauled in a perfect pass from quarterback Barry Radcliffe on a 53-yard picture play which brought about the deadlock.

Radcliffe's try for the extra point after the final touchdown just missed to the left.

Before that the game be-

longed strictly to Radcliffe. The Redskins unleashed a passing attack unlike any Allen had seen in its first two games, and twice in the first half passes paid big dividends.

The Redskins marched 72 yards in five plays for a first-quarter TD. The touchdown play was an 11-yard pass from Ernie Forchetti to end Frank DeMezza. The other big play in the drive was a 34-yard aerial from Forchetti to DeMezza.

In the second quarter, the Redskins hit the scoreboard explosively. With a first down squarely at the 50, Forchetti hit DeMezza at the right sideline. DeMezza, a 6-foot 182-pound senior, broke out of the grasp of Allen defensive back Mike Donsecz at the 20 and scampered the rest of the way for the touchdown.

Allen's first-half TD was set up by a Neshaminy punt which

went only 18 yards to the Redskins' 27. The Canaries moved to a first down at the 6, where Radcliffe tossed a strike to end Neil Pendry in the end zone.

Neshaminy's final touchdown came on the second play of the fourth quarter when Forchetti capped a 28-yard march by rolling around left from the 3.

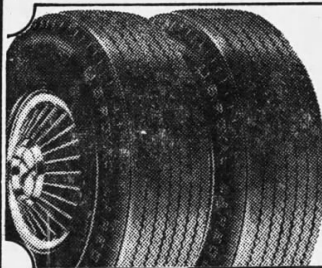
