Bensalem Jars Neshaminy, Ties for Lower Bucks Title

Bensalem High upset Neshaminy, 7-6, before 3300 at Langhorne yesterday to crack the losers' 18-game winning streak and gain a tie with the Redskins for the Lower Bucks County Conference title.

Charley Scioli raced 38 yards on a handoff from quarterback Harry Schurr in the third quarter to tie for Bensalem. Scioli added the extra point on a plunge off tackle to win the game.

Neshaminy scored in the first quarter after Tom Buckley and Eric Latham had recovered Scioli's fumble on the Bensalem 35. An 18-yard run by Don Cameron moved to the 18. Four plays later Cameron skirted left end from the one to score.

A pass, Kauffman to Cameron, failed to gain the extra point.

The victory gave Bensalem and Neshaminy identical records of six triumphs and one loss in the Conference. Previously, Neshaminy had been unbeaten in nine games and had chalked up 18 straight victories over a span of two seasons.
