The Morrisville high school football team that meets Bristol here Thursday morning will be a 1940 Lower Bucks County Scholastic championship unit. This fact was disclosed yesterday by Bensalem's head coach, George Reimer, who is president of the conference.

The Bulldogs virtually assured themselves of the title by defeating Bensalem a few weeks ago. Sweeping through all league rivals, the Blue and Gold combine has lost only two games this year—to Trenton High and unbeaten Burlington.

One obstacle in the path is Bristol. Providing the men of Coach Johnny Hoffman can get by the local crew on Thanksgiving Day, their conference slate will be unmarred. The championships thus far have taken the measure of Bensalem, 13-7; Langhorne, 47-0, and Newtown, 19-6.

Such a state of affairs is nearly a precedent. Annually, before this surprising season, Bristol and Morrisville, long considered the district's two powerhouses, met on even terms in the Turkey fuss. To the winner usually went sectional schoolboy laurels.

But as Reimer figures the complicated rating system, based on the Dickinson method, Morrisville is "in." win, lose or draw against the Cardinals. They cannot be beaten out of the championship.

The "big brown jug" title, shared between the little three schools, is still in doubt. Newtown, by licking Langhorne on the holiday, can tie Bensalem for the cup. A tie will allow Bensalem to retain it. An upset triumph by the Redskins over Newtown will aid the Owls considerably.

Auto Boys had but 4 men, it made the going rather easy for the P. P. P.

Ford V-8 and Auto Boys divided 2-1. The "Oddies" are showing improvement.

The Wilson Keglers won three from the rug makers, Kryven, 571; Bob Blake hit 462.
