MARRIAGE COSTS RISE

BOSTON—(INS)— Couples desiring to marry in Massachusetts are now confronted with greater expenses than heretofore. The law requiring examinations by a physician for all couples desiring to marry in this state became effective November 1st. Previously the cost of a marriage license was \$2.03. Now it is \$6.03, including cost of two examinations. The \$0.03 is to pay for the stamp used by the clergyman in mailing the used license back to the registrar.
