

Bulldogs Favored To Win Saturday Over Langhorne

Morrisville High School's powerful football team plays host to a fighting but inexperienced Langhorne eleven this Saturday on the Morrisville field. In another district contest, Burlington faces Bristol on the latter's home field. Both games are carded to get underway at 2 p. m.

The Bulldogs, who dealt Bensalem a 25 to 0 lambasting last week in their initial conference scrap, are heavily favored to annex another triumph. The offensive maneuvers of the Blue and Gold have been terrific this season with 78 points having been tallied by the defending area champions in the last two games. After dropping their opening fray to Trenton by a one score margin, the lads of Coach John Hoffman have defeated Burlington, Bordentown High, Bordentown Military Institute, Riverside and Bensalem by comfortable margins.

Langhorne has played but two games this year and has lost both. They were beaten by Bristol at George School. In view of the fact that Morrisville scrimmaged against the preppers early in the year and nearly overwhelmed them, the Bulldogs enter Saturday's contest as topheavy favorites.

The Redskins, however, are well coached and will not go down without extending themselves. So far they have lacked the necessary punch and finesse to win, but their passing attack has begun to function more smoothly of late. What they need most of all, however, is a running mate to team with Captain Bobby Reed and some better blocking on the offense.

Morrisville possesses a hard charging line that has not been scored upon in the past three games. They have six starting backs in Hoernle, Neeld, Stradling, Pratt, Harms and Campbell. They are adept in passing as well as running and by rolling over foe after foe have rightfully earned the title of "Notre Dame of Lower Bucks."

Langhorne, which goes to the post for only the third time this season Saturday, has fast been rounding into the best shape possible under the capable guidance of Coach Messias, former Temple ace. Paced by hard charging ~~Frank~~ they will make a diligent attempt to open wider holes this week for Joe Lukens, who ran into stone walls all last week against Bristol. Other probable starters in the backfield will be Wayne Schneider and Merle Schoenfeld. The line, starting from left end to right, will probably be composed of Kaye, Schwind, Wilson, Salvadore, Flack and Walsh.

At Bristol this Saturday a hard battle is expected to occur between Burlington and the Bunnies for the traditional little brown jug. The Blue Devils from New Jersey have been experiencing rough going this year but have been improving from game to game. The Cardinal and Grey, on the other hand, has only dropped one game thus far and are accorded a slight edge over their arch rivals from the side of the Delaware.
