

# BENSALEM POSTS WIN OVER LANGHORNE XI BY A 19 TO 0 SCORE

## Bob Scarborough Speeds To Two Tallies in Easy Triumph

### OFF TO A FAST START

### Winners Did All of Scoring in First Half of The Game

Bensalem High School practically pulled down the curtain on a fairly successful football season Saturday afternoon at Cornwells Heights when they defeated a Langhorne eleven, 19 to 0.

The Owls only have one game remaining on their schedule, a minor fuss with the Alumni on Thanksgiving Day. Saturday's triumph over Langhorne was their fourth of the season. Only two games were lost to Morrisville, probable conference champions, and undefeated Bryn Athyn Academy.

Bobby Scarborough played a star's role in the win over Langhorne by returning to his old time form. Setting up two of the Reimermen's touchdowns by cutting his way around end in dazzling fashion, Scarborough was responsible for two of the scores individually. The all-conference back of the Owls, out nearly all season with a bothersome knee injury, flashed spasmodic exhibitions of his blinding speed several times.

Henry Killian, the Owls accurate pitcher all season, slung a forward pass to Dick Colbert early in the first quarter. Up close on the ten yard line, Colbert merely stepped over for the initial score of the day.

It was evident all during the first half that Bensalem was relying on the ancient strategy of punting and waiting for the break. Often during the game they drove Langhorne back deep into their own territory, forcing them to kick back. On most of these occasions the Redskins lost yardage on the exchange.

Scarborough, threatening to break loose all throughout the first chucker, slipped his way around the left side of the line and skimmed along down the sidelines for an 18 yard touchdown gallop.

The final marker was hung up by the Bensalemites near the close of the first quarter when Killian shot another aerial to Scarborough to jump the count to 19-0. Killian has passed Bensalem to many a score this season.

Langhorne came back fighting during the start of the third quarter and with rugged Warren Gotwald, a good back on a losing ball club, doing much of the tough line cracking, the boys from up on the hill marched to the 27 yard stripe. Here the drive bogged down as a pass was knocked down over the goal line by an alert Bensalem defense.

At no time was Bensalem in great danger. Langhorne had little to offer in the way of a passing attack as all tries were intercepted late in the final half.
