

MORRISVILLE GRIDDERS CRUSH LANGHORNE

MORRISVILLE, Oct. 21—Morrisville High's erratic Bulldog eleven put on the best scoring power in years at Robert Morris Field here Saturday in a biting cold to crush a weak Langhorne High club, 47-0, to open its quest for the 1940 Lower Bucks Football Conference championship.

From the opening whistle, when the Bulldogs marched 85 yards on a sustained touchdown drive, the visitors were never in the game.

The Blues, despite the weak opposition, showed potential power on its end runs and passing attack, getting eight for 20 tries in the latter offensive. The tackling was much better than ever before and if the game is any criterion at all the Blues will be the team to beat for the conference title.
