St. Francis has registered wins over Bordentown Manual Training Institute twice by 7-0 and 6-0 scores and last Thursday decisively defeated Fallsington, 18-0. Langhorne, idle last week, has beaten Fallsington, 12-0, and George School, 27-6.

The light but scrappy St. Francis line that has been unscored upon to date will present the strongest opposition of the season thus far for the locals. However, although the Eddington team packs a punch, it is not expected to offer the calibre of competition that conference foes later in the season will place on the line.

Coach Johnny Messics plans no changes in the Redskins lineup and will send a backfield composed of Ken Caldwell at quarterback, Wayne Schneider and "Chick" Ardis at halfbacks and Captain Joe Lukens at fullback at Brother Benilde's charges. Other backs expected to see action are Russ Haines, Noer and Hibbard.

Halfbacks Running Nicely

So far Lukens and Schneider have been pacing the attack for Langhorne. Both have proved to be fine breakaway runners and are quick to spot openings. They have speed, are good ball handlers and work nicely together. Schneider has been punting capably and passing spot heaves accurately.

Ardis retains his starting berth to add more power to the attack. He is the fastest man in the backfield and can pick up yardage on end arounds when the opposition begins to get tight on the defense.

Russ Haines, however, is not regarded as a reserve back. The powerful South Langhorne lad, who scales about 169 pounds, is as durable as any back in the league and his fiery competitive instincts rate him on par with any runner on the Redskin squad.

Saints Worthy Foe

St. Francis will be a worthy foe for Langhorne. Their unscored upon record bespeaks of outstanding defensive work. Fallsington made only one first down against them last week.

In open field running, the Saints believe they have the equal of Lukens and Schneider in halfbacks Don Oppold and Al Larrow. Marlo Cuppo, however, leads the eleven and calls plays.

Langhorne may feel the effects of last week's idleness, when, in the absence of Coach Messics, a game was not scheduled. However, they have been practicing hard this week and are in top physical shape for the fray.

Langhorne Registers Win Over Falls

'Inky' Schnieder Scores Winning Touchdown in Last Second of Play

Trailing 13-0 at the end of the first half, Langhorne High surged ahead in the last two periods to defeat Fallsington 19-13 in a return engagement grid contest, here, last Saturday.

In the first half the Falls team passed and ran all over the stunned Redskins. Phil DiNatie, speedy Falls' quarterback, tallied twice on passes from Norman White. White plunged through center for the extra point.

Lukens Runs 53 Yards

The second half was a complete reverse of the first. The Redskins took the ball and marched 60 yards for the first score. Chick Ardis landed the ball on the 45. Joe Lukens then took a pass from center, and carried the ball to the 2-yard line. 'Inky' Schnieder then moved within 12 inches of the goal. The Falcons felt the full force of the Lukens' running power, as the Redskin Captain smashed the Falls line to register the first goal. 'Chick' Ardis Scores

In the beginning of the last quarter, with Richard Frutchey handling the quarterback position, the locals scored again. Richard Lukens intercepted a Falls pass, and put the ball on the 50-yard line. 'Inky' Schnieder, 'Chick' Ardis, and Joe Lukens made four successive first downs, and put the Pigskin on the Falls' 8-yard line. Lukens drove to the 4-yard line, and 'Chick' Ardis hit paydirt on an end run. The score then stood at 13-12, with the Redskins still trailing. The Falcons tried in vain to set up an aerial attack, and once again the Playwickians began to unleash their running power. 'Inky' Schnieder went through tackle for 22 yards, Lukens traveled to the 30, and Frutchey battled his way to the 27 for a first down. With time running short, Joe Lukens passed to Ira Romberger. The pass was incomplete, but the Falcons were penalized for interference of the receiver, and the ball rested on Fallsington's 12-yard line. In the very last seconds of the game Schnieder received a pass from Lukens, shook off three Fallsington tacklers, and dived across the double stripe to win the game.

The surprisingly powerful Falls aerial attack was almost the downfall of the Redskins. Norman White, the Fallsington triple threat man, completed eleven forward passes; two of these accounted for touchdowns.

TWO WINNING STREAKS AT STAKE HERE TOMORROW WHEN LANGHORNE ELEVEN WILL OPPOSE HIGH SCHOOL BUNNIES

Two winning streaks will be at stake tomorrow afternoon on the high school field as Bristol plays its annual Lower Bucks County League game with Langhorne. Opening kickoff will take place at two o'clock.

The Bunnies are in possession of a consecutive win streak which has reached four straight, while the Langhorne eleven has won three straight. The Redskins are undefeated, while Bristol lost its opening game to Trenton Catholic.

Coach Harold Stackhouse's boys have amassed a total of 107 points against their foes, while they have had 40 scored against them. In three games, Langhorne has scored 32 counters and has had seven scored against it. In the last four games the opposing teams of Bristol have only been permitted one first down each.

Langhorne comes here with a fine passing attack which features Wayne Schneider and Joe Lukens. Both of these youngsters are well known to the sport fans of this section. Schneider is a baseball pitcher in this section, and can toss a football as well as he throws the horsehide. On the receiving end of most of his passes is Lukens, who also played baseball here, and fans claim that when he catches a forward pass it is in real college style—those one-handed catches.

Whether the Langhorne passing attack can cope with the Bristol offensive remains to be seen. Coach Stackhouse seems to come up with more plays in each game, and appears to know the weakness of all teams on the Bristol schedule. He has drilled his proteges in several news plays which will be on exhibit for the first time tomorrow.

A Bristol victory will assure the Bunnies of at least a tie in the Lower Bucks setup, as they hold the league lead by a victory in the only game played thus far.

While Langhorne is paying Bristol a visit, the Morrisville Bulldogs will be at Cornwells Heights, meeting the Bensalem Owls in another Lower Bucks fracas.
