

# 'REDSKINS' LOSE BY FAILING TO CONVERT A POINT

Langhorne XI Loses To New Jersey School For Deaf

SCORE ENDS AT 7 TO 6

Only Score for Bucks Team Result of Righter's Toss To Schneider

TRENTON, Oct. 20—Failure to convert the extra point prevented the Langhorne Redskins of getting a tie in a gridiron tilt. Yesterday afternoon, the Langhorne team lost to the New Jersey School for Deaf, 7-6.

The only Langhorne score of the game came in the third period when "Doc" Righter tossed a 20-yard pass to "Inky" Schneider who scored without trouble. Schneider went back to attempt the extra point but it seemed as if the entire Deaf School line was atop him before he could get the ball off.

The N. J. S. for Deaf counted their touchdown and extra point in the second session when Hutton went over after a sustained march of 50 yards. Hutton scored on a short line buck. The Deaf School half-back then place-kicked the conversion point which ultimately decided the issue.

## Langhorne Team Travels to Face N. J. Deaf School

Langhorne High School, beaten last week by a fast moving Bordentown Manual Training Institute eleven, 34-0, travels to West Trenton this Friday afternoon to face the New Jersey School for the Deaf team.

Definitely below form, the Redskins have been experiencing difficulty carrying out correct assignments on the line. At the start of the season the club admittedly packed offensive punch with several backs possessing fine passing, punting and running ability. However, lately only Schneider's punting has been outstanding and the line has not been up to par.

Coach John Messias was laboring diligently with his squad all week at Playwicki Field. The fore part of the week found him inserting new boys in strange positions and there is a likelihood some line-up changes may take place for Friday's encounter.

The Deaf School contest will be stiff. The Capitol City lads defeated Bordentown High earlier in the season, 32-0, while the Bordentown Manual machine that handled the Redskins so roughly only posted a 12-0 decision over the same club.

Last week the Deaf School sustained a 26-0 beating from Bordentown Military Institute. The same B. M. I. squad also licked Bensalem earlier in the year, 31-12. The only other game played by N. J. S. D. was against Highland Park, a school located near New Brunswick. Highland turned in a 7-2 win. All season, with the exception of the B. M. I. fiasco, the Deaf School has been a good defensive outfit.

## LANGHORNE HIGH BEATS GEORGE SCHOOL

GEORGE SCHOOL, Oct. 8—Langhorne High School came through with its second victory of the season Saturday afternoon, defeating the George School eleven, 12-6, in a hard-fought contest.

The Redskins scored their touchdowns in the first and third quarters and held a 12-0 lead until late in the third session when the George School lads opened an attack which led to their lone six-pointer.

It was Wayne Schneider who accounted for the first Langhorne touchdown. The Redskins took the ball on the opening kick-off and marched right down the field to the 25-yard line where Schneider made himself a committee of one to take it over. The try for the extra point, a place-kick by Schneider, failed.

"Doc" Righter scored the second touchdown after the Langhorne team had pushed the George Schoolers from their own 30-yard line back to the goal line. Righter went over from the one-foot mark. Schneider's try for the extra point again failed.

Using deceptive football tactics, George School's best offensive playing came in the third period. Cromwell and Saurman paced this attack with Saurman finally going over the final chalk stripe with a line rush.
