

# Lower Moreland in 6-6 Tie With Langhorne on Gridiron

Aerial fireworks were the order at Huntingdon Valley Field yesterday as Lower Moreland and Langhorne battled to a 6-6 tie in their football opener.

Two thrusts through the air told the tale when Lower Moreland tallied in the third quarter, only to be stalemated by a Langhorne touchdown which resulted from an intercepted pass in the fourth period.

Carl Ebert scored for Lower Moreland when he caught a 30-yard heave from Bill Ridgway while standing in the end zone. Near the end of the game Walt Steming knotted the count when he caught a 20-yard toss from Jack Clark. In both cases the try for the extra point was missed.

While the Ridgway-to-Ebert combination was the main cog in the Lower Moreland offense, the Lions were able to hold the Langhorne eleven at bay most of the game through the work of Bill Gantt, 185-pound tackle. Time after time the visitors were also shunted right back

to their goal-line by boots from the toe of Ridgway.

The Lower Moreland touchdown pass culminated a 70-yard drive, in which Dick Hinds and Bill Ridgway were the big guns of attack as they hammered the Langhorne line unmercifully.

Ed Gotwals set the stage for the tying tally when he intercepted a Ridgway pass at midfield. Bill Fox ripped big holes in the line to carry the oval, in two first downs, to the 20-yard line, whence the Clark-Steming aerial was engineered.
