

Redskins Score

Came on a Well Rehearsed Play

In pulling their 7-0 upset win over Bensalem, which was a Langhorne triumph shared by every player who took part in the game, the Redskins came up with a last down, last ditch, picture play that was perfectly executed.

Don Kaleda started the fireworks by intercepting a pass on the Owls 30 yard line. In two tries at the line, Schneider and Fallon picked up 13 yards. Doc Righter then found Fallon with a pass on the six and after two line plays failed to pick up any yardage, Bensalem was penalized for being off-sides to the one yard stripe.

At this crucial point, Bensalem's line caught fire. Turner seeped through to throw Lukens back to the eight on an end sweep. Righter followed with a pass intended but Kleha batted it down. After another line stab failed, Fallon took the ball on a T formation play and lateralled to Righter who sped hard to his own right to score and make it 6-0. Inky Schneider powered his way over for the extra point.

Previous to this, Schneider had scored on a 46 yard pass play from Righter, but it was nullified by a backfield in motion penalty. The Redskins, dominating most of the time, worked inside the Bensalem 10 yard line in the last quarter and were on their way to another score when the game ended.
