Redskins Lose 3rd  
Straight Tilt To  
Eddystone Eleven

A powerful Eddystone team sent Neshaminy skidding to its third defeat of the campaign last night by upsetting them, 20-6, on the Redskins' rain-sodden home grounds.

Again, as last week, the defeat brings forth speculation as to the extent the rain played in slowing down Neshaminy's vaunted aerial offensive.

But even under the extremely wet conditions of last night, the Redskins' passing attack was impressive. Errol Faunce threw 14 and connected for eight of them, averaging slightly less than 22 yards each on those he completed.

Neshaminy's chief weakness is still in the middle of the line. Pleasantville capitalized on it last week, and the Stoners hit the mid-

dle hard and often last night with devastating results.

6-0 Lead

The Redskins got off to a six-point lead in the first quarter when George Rumsey grabbed a partially blocked pass and galloped 86 yards for a touchdown. The kick for the extra point failed, and that ended Neshaminy's scoring for the evening.

The Stoners scored their first touchdown with only two minutes remaining in the first half. Dom Marion, 205-pound fullback and son of the Eddystone head coach, went off guard for a long 57-yard run and crossed standing up. Bob Armstrong placekicked the extra point to put the Stoners ahead, 7-6.

Marion Scores

Marion scored two more TD's in the third period. The first was on a one-yard plunge, and the second, on a 47-yard jaunt. Armstrong added another extra point on the last touchdown.

The fleet, 205-pound fullback gave the Redskins no end of trouble all evening, and Marion made the most of the defensive weakness in the Neshaminy line.

The game was called two minutes and 20 seconds short of official completion when the lighting system failed. Play was interrupted

twice during the fourth quarter by failures in the portable lighting system.
