Nesaminy, in typical fashion, slammed the Owls early and then ran to win in its 18th victory in 19 out of the season. The Owls' lone score was a stifling 13-0 in the second quarter. The "Rough Riders" of Nesaminy scored two touchdowns before the game. Haines, Harry Schuch and Roy Becker, who scored the first touchdown on the game, were named MVP's. Haines, a senior center who led the Owls and completed five of the seven, was good for fourth down.

It was a fitting tribute for coach Harry Francis of Nesaminy. The Redskins lost to the Owls in the championship in '67, but in the 1968 season overcame a 1-7 record to win the title. Nesaminy's scoring machine is led by Tom Juno, who has scored 15 touchdowns and 109 points.

For coach Marvin Van Horn of Besenham, the game was the worst defeat in seven years. He coached the Owls to a 1-6 record and returned the season to take over an all-league team. Twenty-one players will be named to the All-Besenham team. Besenham now has a 2-6 record.

Nesaminy's crushing victory yesterday, which was evident from the very start, was the second highest total over the 1968 season in 36 years. Nesaminy now has a 7-4 record.
